WEBINAR SERIES

All webinars will be held twice, at **10-11.30 AM and 4-5.30 PM GMT**, to cater for representatives from different time zones.

WEBINAR 1 (1st November) The speakers will give an overview of EU programmes, including Horizon Europe for Research and Innovation projects, and Erasmus+ for Student and Staff mobility and Collaboration. They will identify the most suitable opportunities for institutions outside the EU, especially in low and middle-income countries, and give a sense of the most suitable concepts for each project.

WEBINAR 2 (7th November): Participants will be given unique insights into the main components of a successful bid, including building the right consortium, devising appropriate objectives and action plan and designing project outcomes to ensure funding is secured. Real examples will be used to illustrate both the qualities that make a successful bid and the potential pitfalls.

WEBINAR 3 (10th January): As a follow-up to the workshops on preparing a proposal, the final workshop will explore the approaches and techniques for ensuring a successful project. The presentations will include how to manage a consortium, budget control, monitoring and sustainability. The workshop will be based on extensive experience managing projects under a range of EU programmes.
