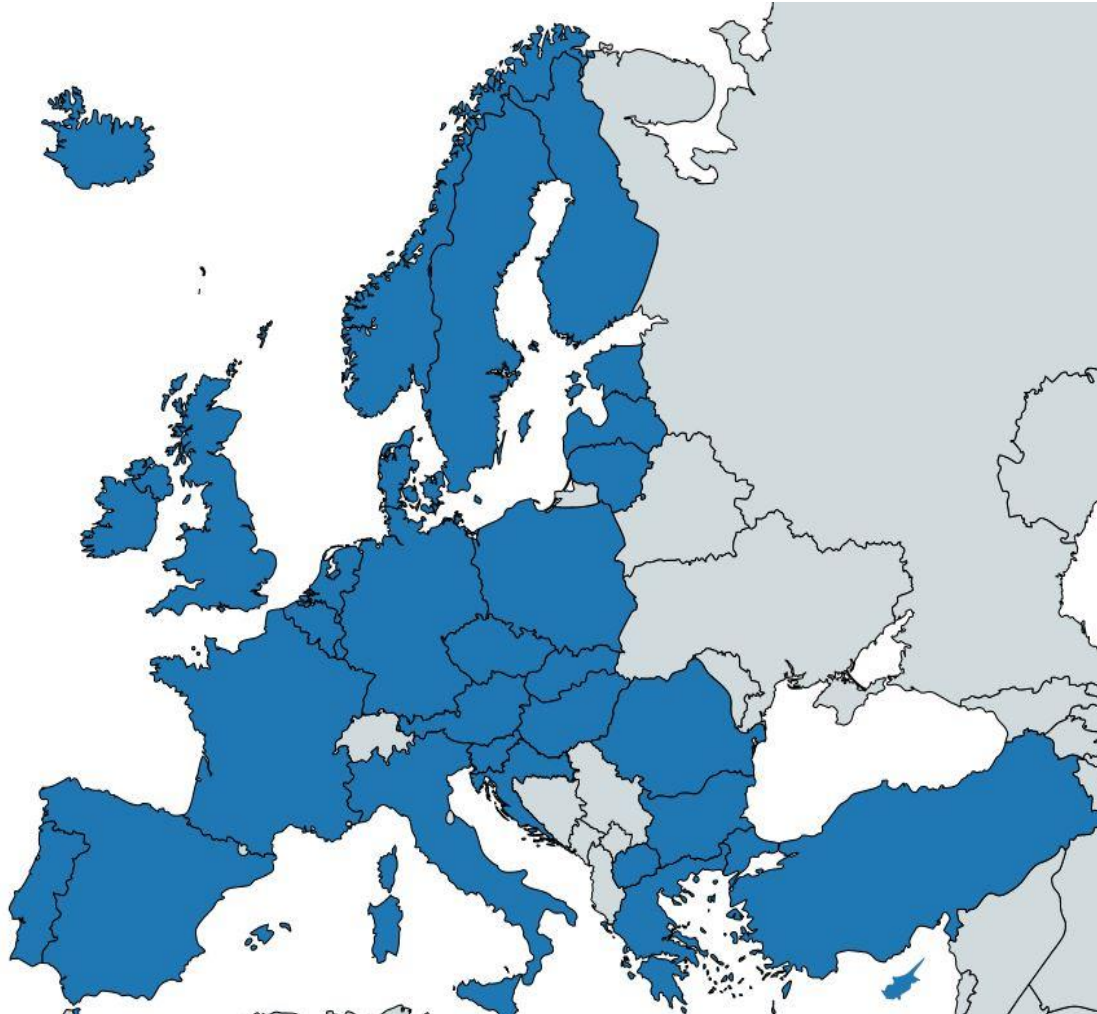

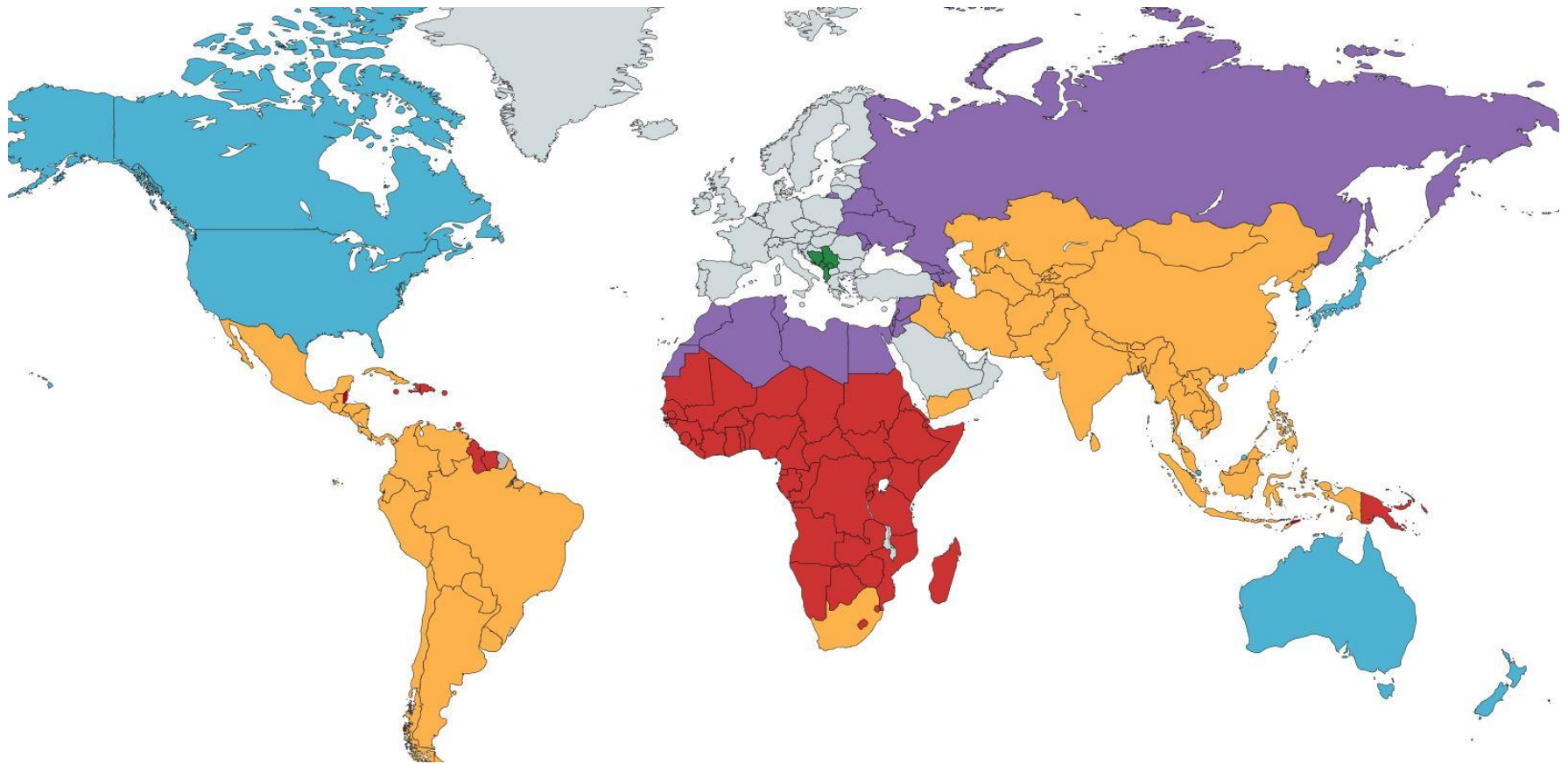

Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility

General characteristics

- Credit mobility for students and staff between programme and partner countries
- Activities on a bilateral basis between institutions
- Introduced in 2015 (academic year 2015/16)
- Provisions similar to the „regular“ Erasmus programme within programme countries
- Higher education institution in programme country responsible for the project
- Decentralised action administrated by National Agencies
 - Austria: OeAD /National Agency Erasmus+ Education

Mobility opportunities for students



- **Study period** (3 – 12 months)
 - At partner higher education institutions
- **Traineeship period** (2 – 12 months)
 - At enterprises and organisations in programme or partner countries
- **Financial support**
 - **Outgoing** students from Austria: 700 Euro per month
 - **Incoming** students to Austria : 850 Euro per month
 - **Travel grant** calculation based on distance between sending and receiving institution (“**distance band**”)

Mobility opportunities for HE staff



Staff mobility for teaching/training (5 – 60 days)

- **Teaching** at partner universities
- **Staff training** such as professional courses, job shadowing etc.
- **New in 2018:** involvement of enterprises (staff training at enterprises; invite employees from enterprises to teach at a higher education institution)

Financial support

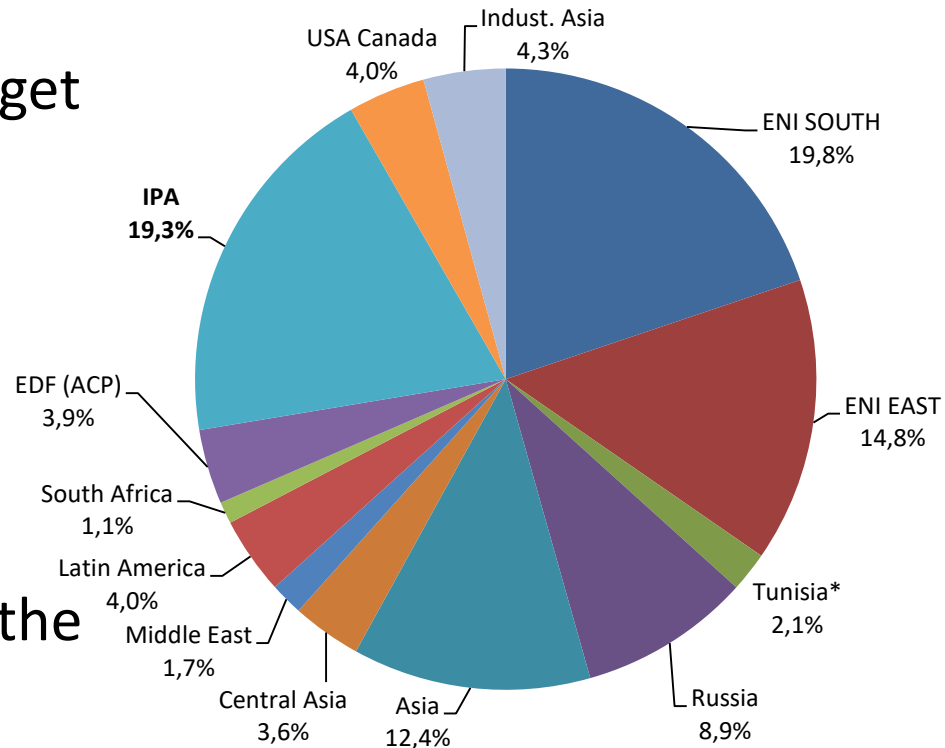
- **Outgoing** staff from Austria: 180 Euro per day
- **Incoming** staff to Austria: 160 Euro per day
- **Travel grant** calculation based on distance between sending and receiving institution („**distance band**“)

Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility

Available budget

European Budget 2018: 160 Mio. EUR

- Split into several **regional budget envelopes**
- Total budget **divided** between 33 programme countries
- **Austria's share**: 3,3 Mio. Euro (= 2% of total budget)
- Budget structure **focusses on** the European Union's foreign policy **priority regions**

Russia (ENI & PI)	305.482

- 9% of the total available budget (Austria: 300.000 Euros)
- Largest budget window for one single country
 - > Asia window: approximately same amount of funds for 19(!) different partner countries
- Demand does not exceed supply by much

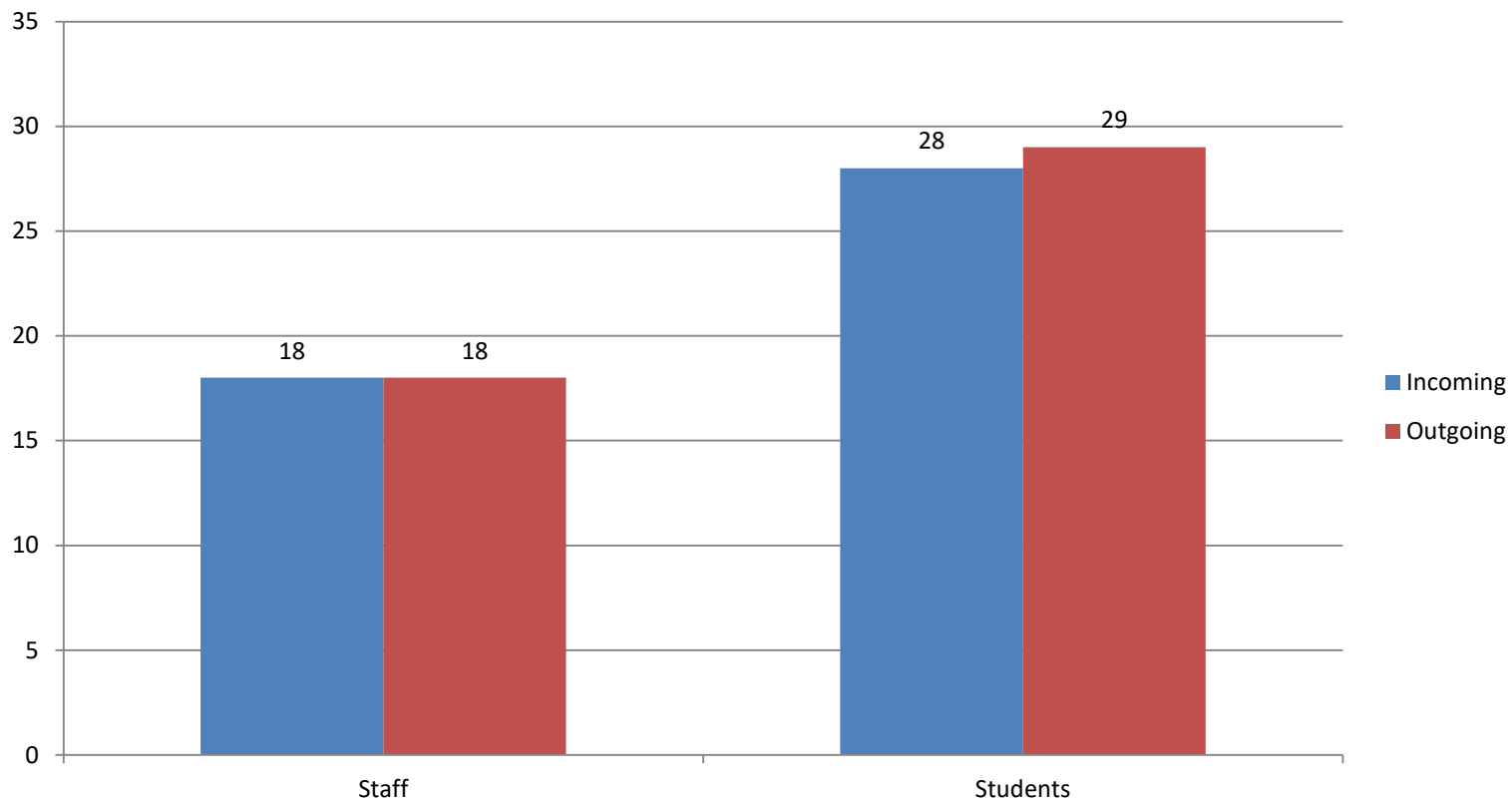

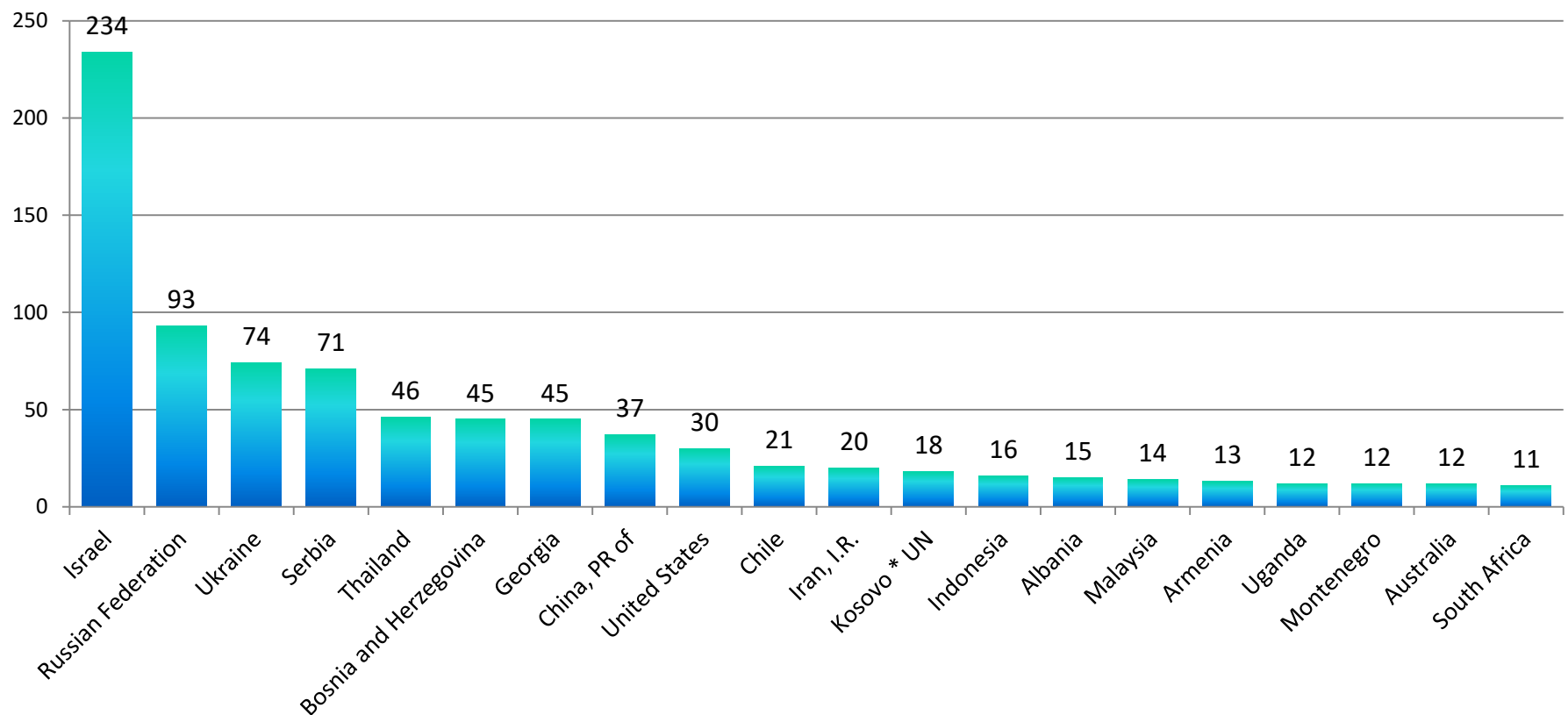
- Mobilities between Austria and Russia Call 2017

Application procedure



- Annual call – next deadline **February 2019**
- Only **programme country** HEIs can **apply**
- One main application containing „**sub-applications**“ for each and **every partner country**
- Applications **assessed** against **four criteria**:
 - **Relevance** of the strategy – 30 pts
 - Quality of the **cooperation arrangements** – 30 pts
 - Quality of the **activity design and implementation** – 20 pts
 - **Impact** and dissemination – 20 pts
- **Assessment** and **grant award** decision done **separately** for every partner country

- Take your **time** to prepare the application
- Make use of **existing networks** and build upon **established partnerships**
- Take into **consideration** the **specific characteristics** of the application
- **Partner** country institution's **perspective** is just as **important** as the applicant institution's one!
- Start with **staff mobility** when targeting a **new** partner
- **Cooperation** with **more than one HEI** within one partner country is possible

What to talk about before the application

- **Relevance** of the strategy
 - Which **departments** of both institutions are involved and why is the cooperation relevant for them?
 - Actual **academic content** of the cooperation
 - **Added value** both for students/staff and institutions
- **Quality of the cooperation arrangements**
 - Previous **experiences** with regard to Erasmus+ or similar funding programmes in the **past**
 - Who is **responsible** for the project **implementation** at both institutions?
 - How will **communication** work between the partners

Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility

What to talk about before the application



- Quality of the **project implementation**
 - **Selection** procedure and criteria applied
 - **Support** for participants before, during and after the mobility at both institutions
 - How will the mobility be **recognized** at the sending institution
- **Impact and dissemination**
 - How will institutions, participants and (possibly) other sectors **benefit** from this cooperation?
 - How will the results be **disseminated** (conferences, events, projects, papers, social media) > put **demonstrative** and **colourful** examples
