

## Mag. Günter Wageneder

studied educational science at the University of Salzburg until 2000 (diploma). He then was part of a team introducing eLearning and eTeaching at the University of Salzburg, being especially responsible for didactics, teaching methodology and evaluations. From 2004 on he was responsible for the development and introduction of Quality Management concepts and tools for study programs and teaching. Since 2010 he is head of Quality Management at the University of Salzburg, being responsible for the Universities Quality Management System (QMS; including study programs, teaching, research, administration, HR, ...). This QMS was successfully accredited in a quality audit in the academic year 2013/14. During the academic years 2015/16 and 2016/17 he was additionally responsible for the development of a QMS for a joint master programme with 10(!) partner institutions ([www.euro-ps.org](http://www.euro-ps.org)). He also co-managed the accreditation of this programme following the “European Approach for the Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes” (as the second accreditation procedure of that kind in whole Europe). Since autumn 2016 Günter Wageneder is appointed as one of Austria’s “National Experts for the European Higher Education Area” and as such he is a member of the Austrian Bologna Follow Up Group. During the last years he visited several Higher Education Institutions in the Balkans.



### Fields of professional expertise:

- Developing, implementing and managing the QMS of the University of Salzburg, regarding study programmes and teaching following the “Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area” (ESG);
- Development and implantation of several single measures of quality assurance and development in administration, HR etc.
- Developing and implementing several single measures of quality development and quality assurance for study programmes and teaching; especially regarding competence-oriented teaching and learning and the concept of intended learning outcomes;
- Innovation of teaching in general; currently especially focusing on research-based teaching and learning (with conference participation, organisation, moderations, ...);
- Together with another EHR-expert composition of the national recommendations of the Austrian BFUG on the implementation of the ECTS user’s guide 2015;
- Teaching staff development courses in the field of teaching innovation etc.;
- Development of a QMS for a joint master consortium, accreditation of the respective programme following the European Approach for the Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes;
- Management of various evaluation procedures (teaching and learning in HEI; process of the recruitment of professors; evaluation of individual staff members; evaluation of departments);
- Management of the University of Salzburg’s participation in U-Multirank;
- Participating, organising, moderating and giving talks at various conferences;
- Managing the University of Salzburg’s membership in the HRS4R-process to implement the “European Charter for Researchers and a Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers”;
