- Established in 1994 as a **science and research network** by Austrian and South-East Asian Universities from Indonesia, Thailand, and Vietnam



ASEAN-European Academic University Network

(ASEA-UNINET)

- The network foundation dates back to informal contacts between the University of Innsbruck (AT) and Thai Universities in the 1970s;
- Currently, the ASEA-UNINET consists of **over 90 universities** from 14 European and Asian countries – 85 full members and 8 candidate members

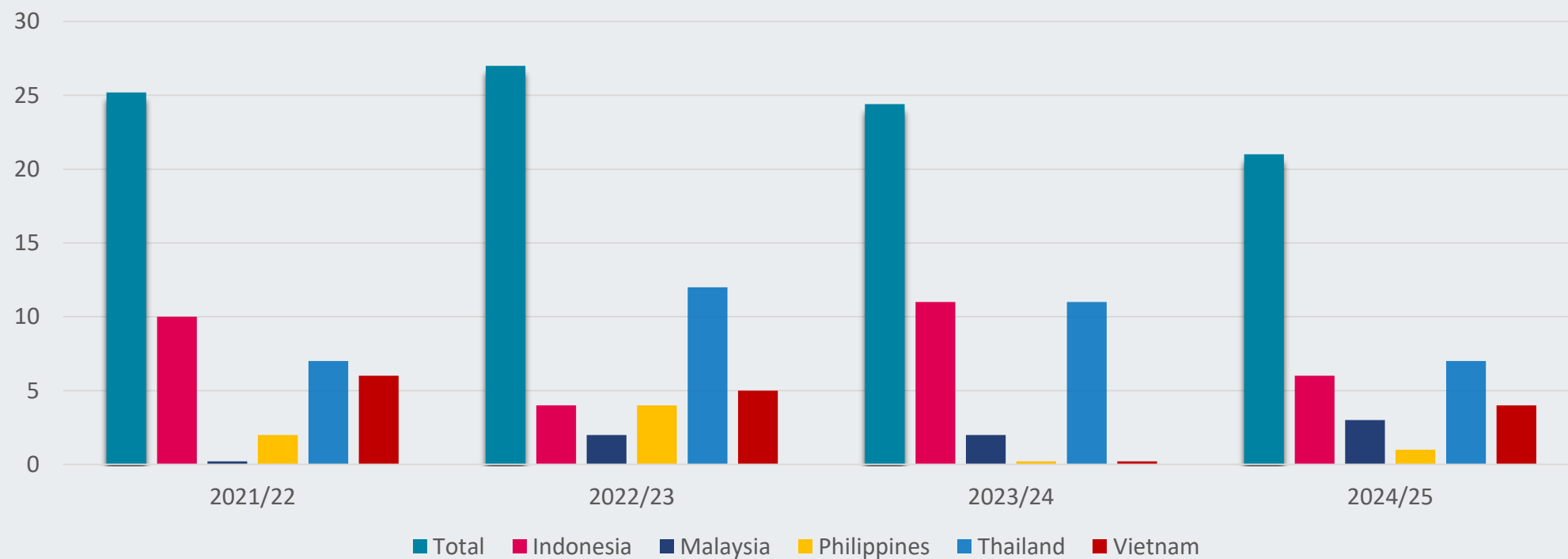

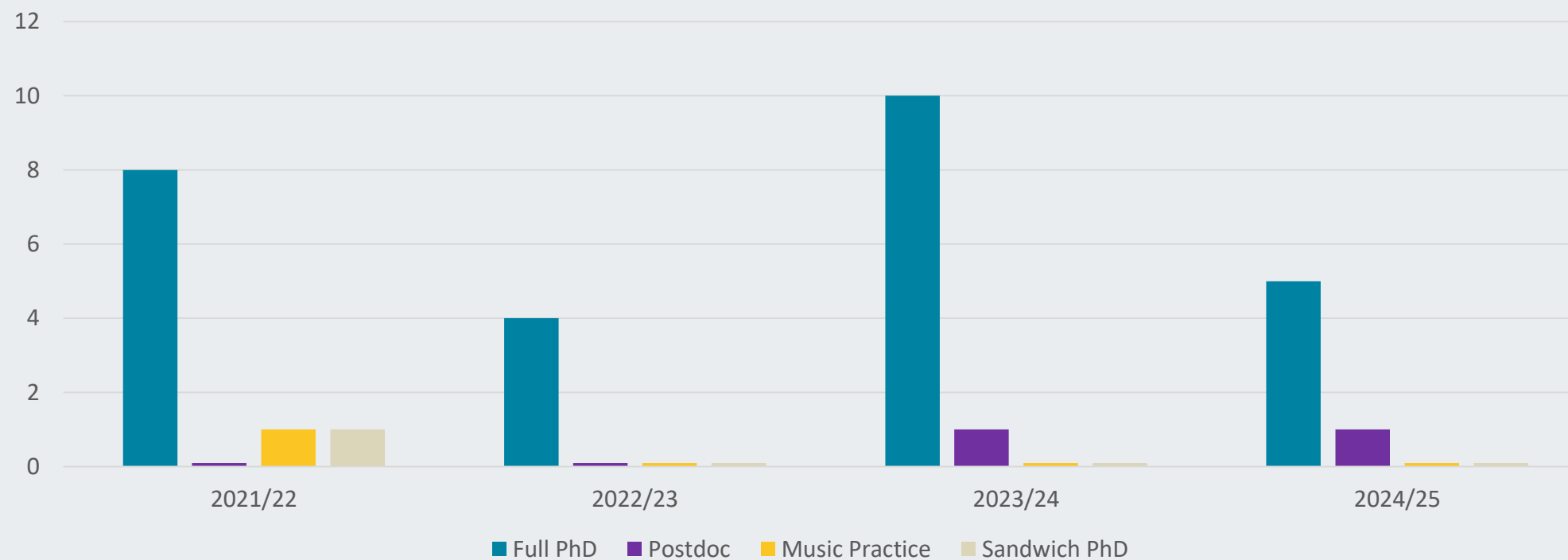

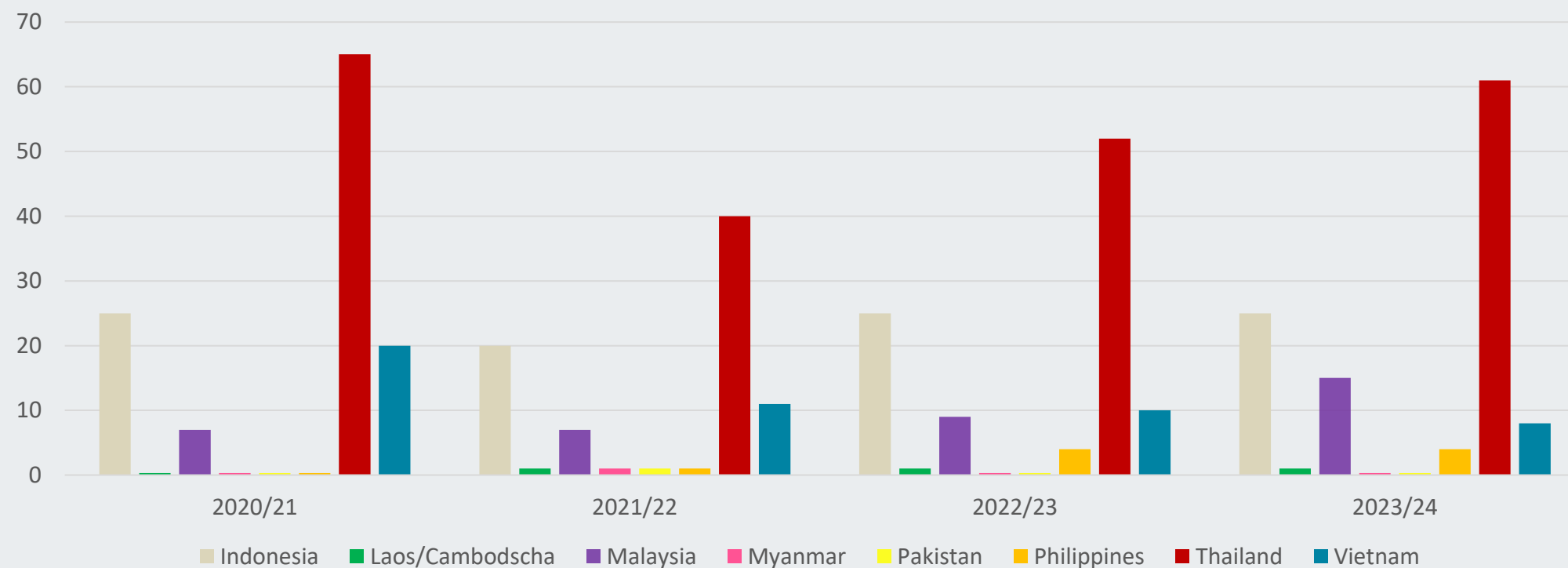
