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1. Service chain



www.oead.at

The service chain serves as mental aid for the OeAD's publicly accessible offers for events and counselling sessions.

The service chain describes the services offered by the OeAD, from first information, how to get to the OeAD, and what is offered on the premises of the OeAD.

The OeAD service chain includes the following elements:

- + Contact information
- + How to get there
- + Entrance
- + Lifts, stair lifts
- + 1st floor: reception, waiting area, meeting room 1.12, accessible toilet
- + Lower ground floor, function rooms 1 to 4, accessible toilet
- + Escape routes

In the following chapters the elements of the service chain will be described in detail.

These descriptions should help you to assess whether or not you can use the services that the OeAD offers.

1.1. Contact information

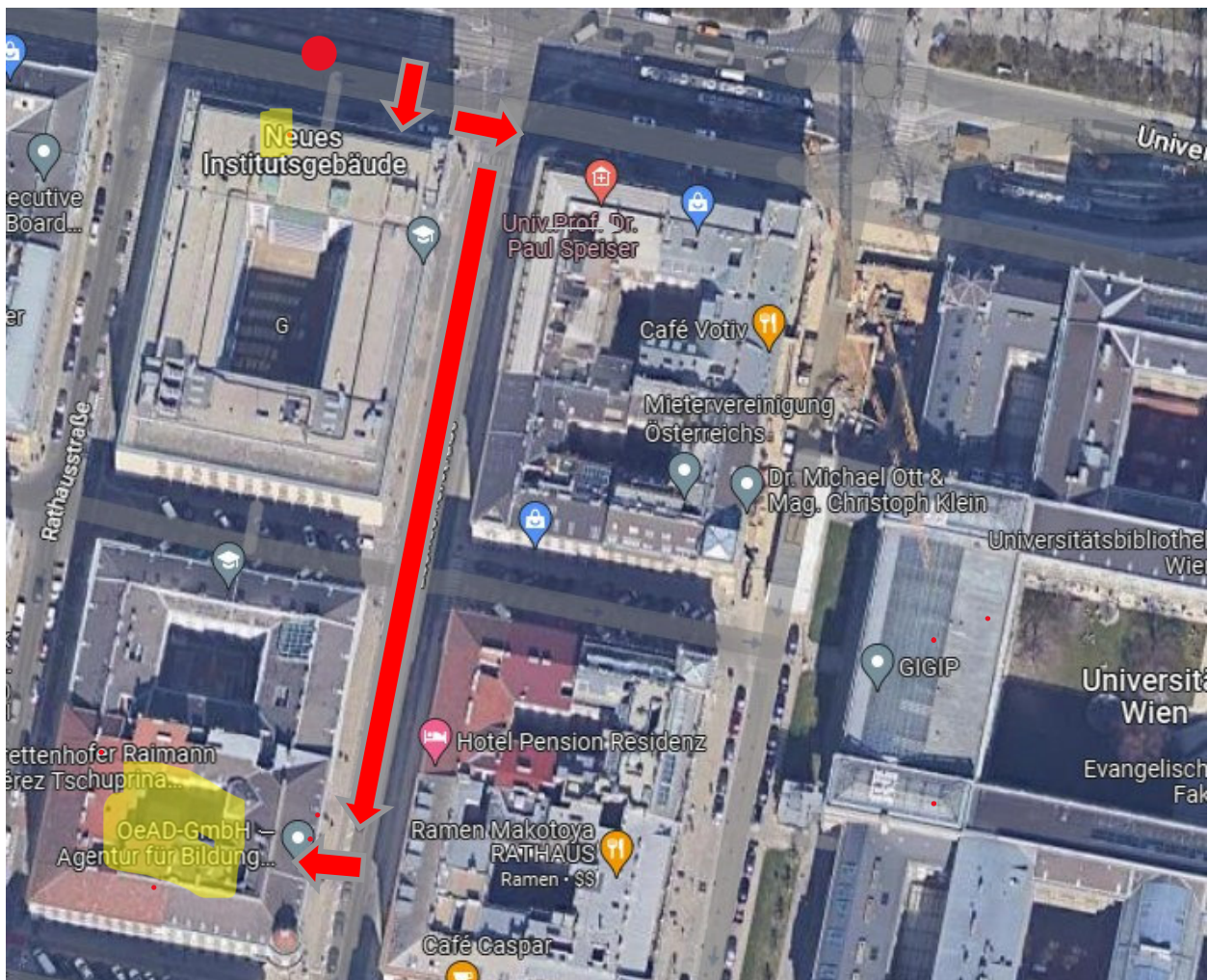

1.2. How to get there by public transport

1.2.1. By tram 43 or 44 to Landesgerichtsstraße stop – approximately 200 meters on foot

Take tram 43 or 44 to Landesgerichtsstraße stop. Cross Universitätsstraße (traffic lights with signal) and turn slightly left to the corner of Ebendorferstraße. Walk along Ebendorferstraße until you get to number 7.

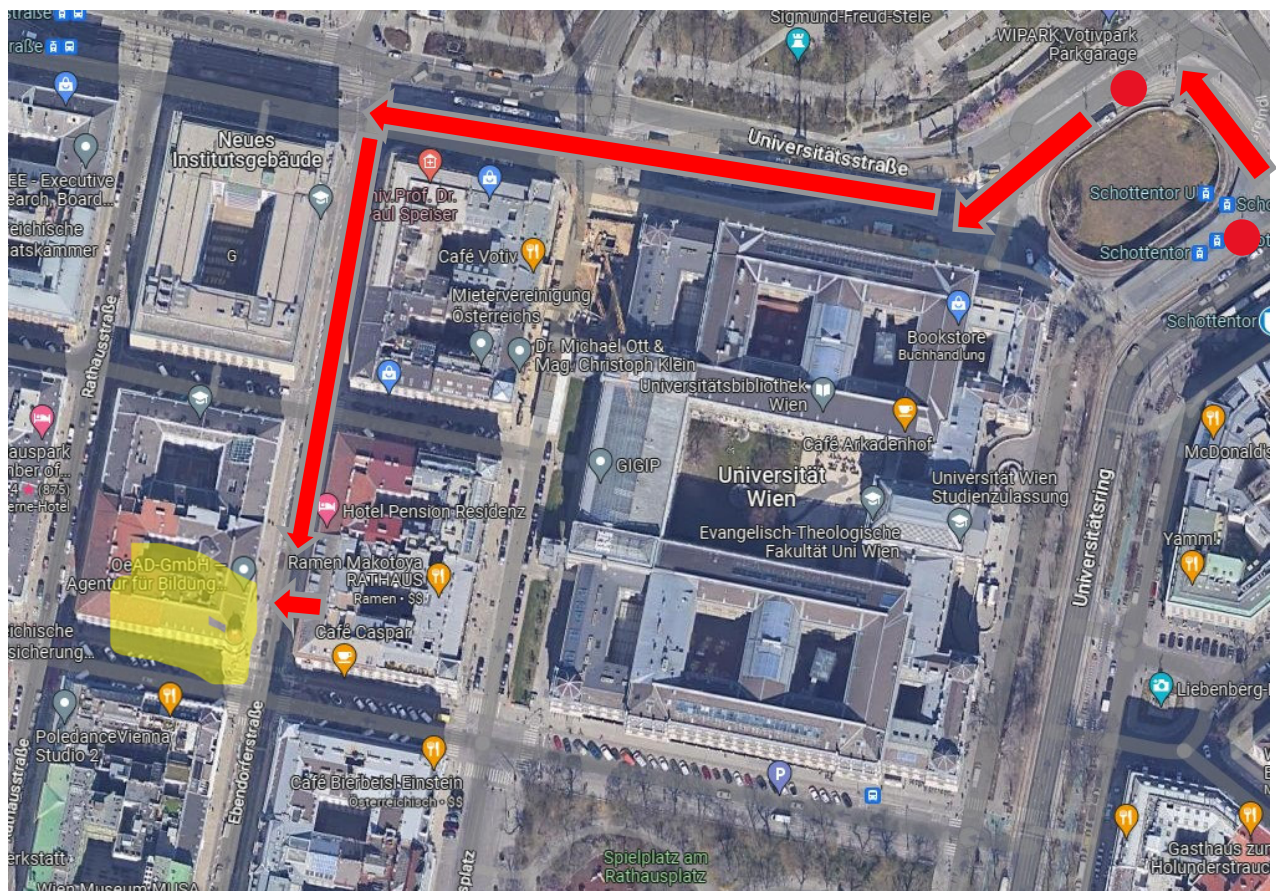


Picture 1: Walking path from the tram stop Landesgerichtsstraße to the OeAD building at Ebendorferstraße 7.

1.2.2. Arrival by underground line U2 at Schottentor station – approximately 350 meters on foot

You can reach Schottentor station by tram lines 1, 71, D, 37, 38, 40 or 41, underground line U2 or bus 1A. Take the University exit (“Universität”) (lift available). At the exit of the lift there is the stop for tram lines 43 and 44. For a description see the paragraph above at 1.2.1. regarding Landesgerichtsstraße stop.

You can also walk from here: From the exit of the lift walk left to the University of Vienna building. Turn right and walk along Universitätsstraße to the corner of Ebendorferstraße and cross it (2 traffic lights with signal). Turn left and walk along Ebendorferstraße until you get to number 7.

1.3. Travelling by car, parking, arrival

The OeAD's Ebendorferstraße 7 location is in the city of Vienna's fee-paying short-stay parking area (weekdays from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.).

There are no customer parking spaces in front of the OeAD building. There are parking spaces right in front of the entrance of the building but they are restricted to residents with parking permits. Adjacent to the OeAD building, in Grillparzerstraße and Liebiggasse, there are public parking spaces that don't require a parking permit.

1.4. Entrance to the OeAD building, Ebendorferstraße 7

The walking path from the surrounding public parking spaces to the entrance of the OeAD building is level with a paved pavement.

There is a ramp connecting the roadway of Ebendorferstraße to the pavement in front of the OeAD's entrance door. There is no tactile guidance system to the main entrance.

1.5. Access, entrance to the OeAD building

During opening hours you enter the OeAD building via an automatic sliding glass door. It is 1 m 59 cm wide. The entrance is level. Still outside the sliding glass door on the wall on the right there is a call button with an intercom. If you need assistance, please press the button. You will then be connected to the reception staff during opening hours. The reception desk is staffed Mondays to Thursdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Fridays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. You can also reach the reception by telephone: +43 1 53408-0.

1.6. Entrance area on the ground floor

There is no threshold in the entrance area after the sliding glass door. There is no tactile floor information. Attention: Please don't go straight ahead down the stairs. There is no entrance there.

1.6.1. Main entrance and access to the staircase to the upper floors and reception

1.6.2. Access to the OeAD Regional Office

From the entrance area you can get to the OeAD Regional Office on the right by means of an accessible staircase with stair lift or via 15 steps.

From the entrance area you can reach the OeAD Regional Office on the right via an accessible staircase with stair lift or via 15 steps.

1.6.2.1. Stair lift to the Regional Office

You will need a Euro Key to use the stair lift. If you don't have one, you can request one in advance at the reception or at the OeAD Regional Office. For assistance please inform your contact person at the OeAD in advance and/or call +43 1 53408-0.

Please note: The control panel for this stair lift is located on the wall opposite, as marked with a red arrow in the picture.

1.6.2.2. Data regarding the accessible stair lift

Width of the stairway next to the stair lift: 1 m 56 cm
 Height of the steps: 13 cm
 Tread surface of the steps: 37 cm
 Handrail: height: 90 cm
 Max. load capacity: 300 kg
 Brand: Ganser, Type GTL30

1.6.3. Entrance to the four function rooms on the lower ground floor

Opposite the main entrance is the entrance to the function rooms 1 to 4. The arrow pointing to the left indicates the glass door entrance to the accessible stair lift to the function rooms 1, 2, 3 and 4 on the lower ground floor. You will reach the stair lift after passing through the hinged glass door. It has to be opened manually. You now descend the 12 steps (or take the stair lift) and get to another glass door that is 1 m 25 cm wide.

1.6.3.1. Stair lift to the function rooms on the lower ground floor

After passing through the glass door you will reach the stair lift. You will need a Euro Key to use the stair lift. If you don't have one, you can request one in advance from the reception or the OeAD Regional Office. For assistance please inform your contact person at the OeAD in advance and/or call +43 1 53408-0.

1.6.3.2. Data regarding the accessible stair lift

The door is 1 m 2 cm wide, and 1 m 65 cm when fully opened. It is a hinged door that is opened and closed manually. There is an 80 cm lateral approach area in front of the door.

There is a manoeuvre space of at least 150 x 150 cm before and after the stair lift (entrance and exit). The control panel for the stair lift is located at a height of 96 cm.

Width of the stairway next to the stair lift: 1 m 56 cm

Height of the steps: 13 cm

Tread surface of the steps: 37 cm

Handrail: height: 90 cm

Max. load capacity: 300 kg

Brand: Ganser, Type GTL30

1.6.4. Access to OeAD student housing

Opposite the OeAD Regional Office is OeAD student housing. The stairs marked with a red arrow in the picture above lead to OeAD student housing. The staircase is not wheelchair accessible.

1.7. First floor with reception, meeting rooms 1.11 and 1.12

1.7.1. What can you find on the first floor?

- Reception
- Meeting rooms 1.11 and 1.12 (accessible)
- Accessible toilet

The reception is located on the first floor of the OeAD building. From the entrance area go through the glass door on the right to the accessible lift. The glass door is a hinged door that opens outwards. You must open it manually. The glass door is at least 1 m 2 cm wide, the maximum width is 1 m 65 cm.

Once you pass through the door you will be in the stairwell and in front of the accessible lift, which is immediately to your left, in the middle of the stairwell. There is no tactile floor information.

1.7.2. Accessible lift to the upper floors

1.7.2.1. Data regarding the accessible lift:

Exterior:

Height of the call button for the accessible lift (the one on the left): 1 m 10 cm. Automatic sliding doors: width: 85 cm

Inside the cabin:

Height of the push button for the 3rd floor: 1 m 2 cm

Width: 88 cm

Depth: 1 m 96 cm

The lift has buttons to all floors with Braille lettering. There are no tactile signs. There is no handrail.

1.7.3. Reception on the 1st floor

The reception is open on Mondays to Thursdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Fridays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. You can reach them by telephone on +43 1 53408-0 and they offer assistance with entering and leaving the building, if requested.

The reception is located on the first floor and can be reached by a lift. The entrance door is on the right, coming from the lift. There are no tactile floor information or textured surfaces in front of the doors.

The hinged glass door has to be opened manually; it opens outwards towards the stairwell. The door opens 90 degrees outwards. If you need assistance, please contact the reception staff.

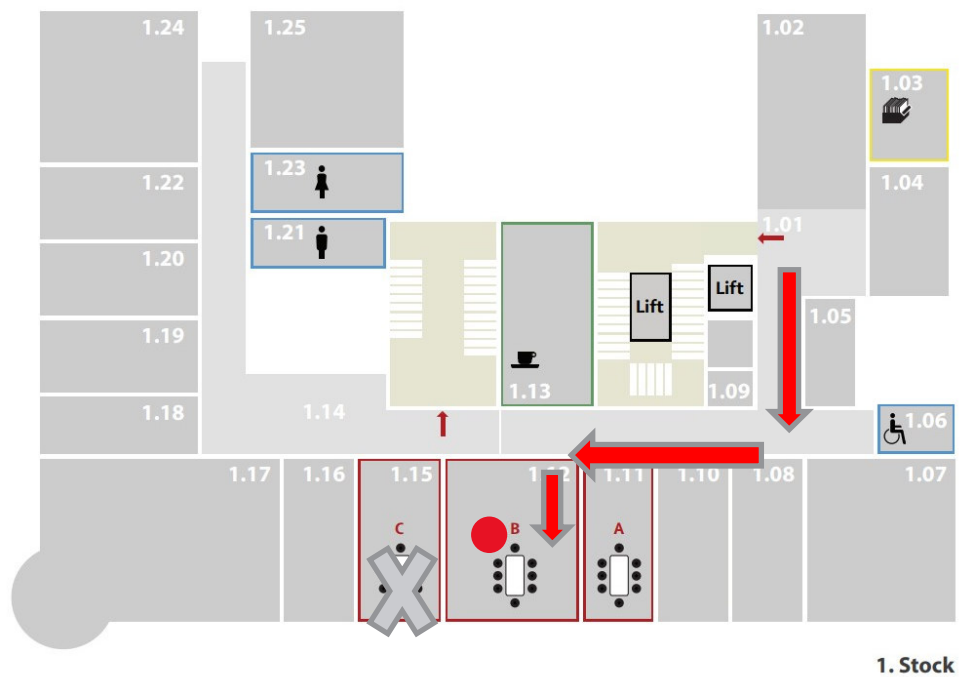


Figure 13: Room plan Ebendorferstraße 7, 1st floor meeting room 1.12

1.8. Accessible toilet in room 1.06. on the 1st floor

Opposite the reception desk on the first floor starts the corridor to the accessible toilet in room 1.06. Go along the corridor and turn left at the end.

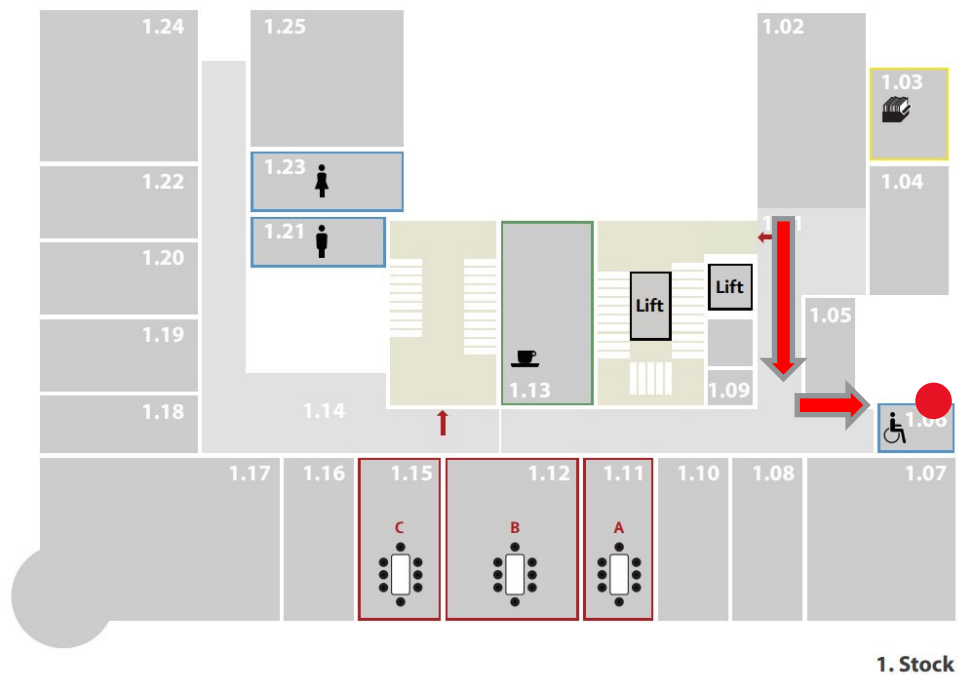


Figure 14: Accessible toilet in Ebendorferstraße 7, 1st floor, room 1.06

From the meeting room 1.12. turn right and go straight ahead to the end of the corridor.

You enter the toilet through a hinged door that opens outwards, you have to open it by hand.

1.8.1. Data regarding the accessible toilet on the first floor

Depth of the toilet seat: 45/69 cm

Height of the toilet seat: 47 cm

Toilet accessible by wheelchair from the left side.

Equipped with grab rails (L-shaped grab rail on the wall side and fold-down rail). The turning radius is 1 m 50 cm. The washbasin is wheelchair accessible.

Height of the controls for the fittings: 85 cm.

The disinfectant is at a height of 1 m 45 cm.

There is an emergency alarm cord, which will connect you to the reception staff.

1.9. Lower ground floor with function rooms 1, 2, 3 and 4

The OeAD has four function rooms on the lower ground floor. They are directly accessible from the entrance area.

1.9.1. What can you find on the lower ground floor?

- Function room 1, function room 2, function room 3 and function room 4
- Accessible toilet

1.9.2. Function room 1

The entrance to function room 1 is accessible. The entrance is located in the entrance area on the left. Function room 1 is the largest function room at the OeAD. After leaving the stair lift you will find another glass door that opens outwards (to be opened manually).

Passage width of the door: 1m 25 cm.

Turn right and then immediately right again.

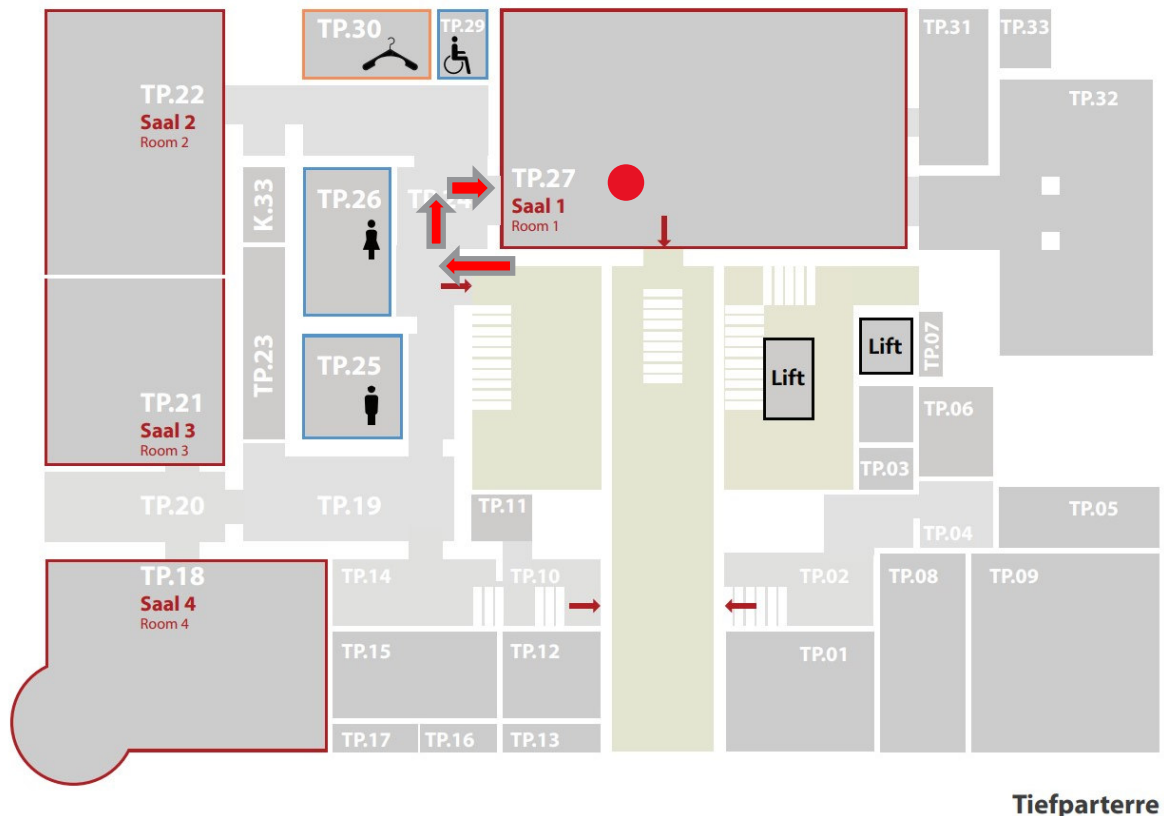


Figure 15: Room plan Ebendorferstraße 7, lower ground floor, function rooms

1.9.2.1. Data regarding function room 1

Passage width of the door: 1 m 20 cm

Desk height (bottom edge of the desktops): 70 cm

Seating is adaptable. Chairs are equipped with backrests. Desks are wheelchair accessible.

The room is equipped with power sockets.

1.9.2.2. Technical equipment

The room does not have an inductive hearing system. Lighting is glare-free.

1.9.3. Function room 2 and/or function room 3

The function rooms 2 and 3 can be used separately or together.

After leaving the stair lift you will find another glass door that opens outwards (to be opened manually). Turn right, go straight ahead and at the end of the corridor turn left. At the end of this corridor is the entrance to function room 2.

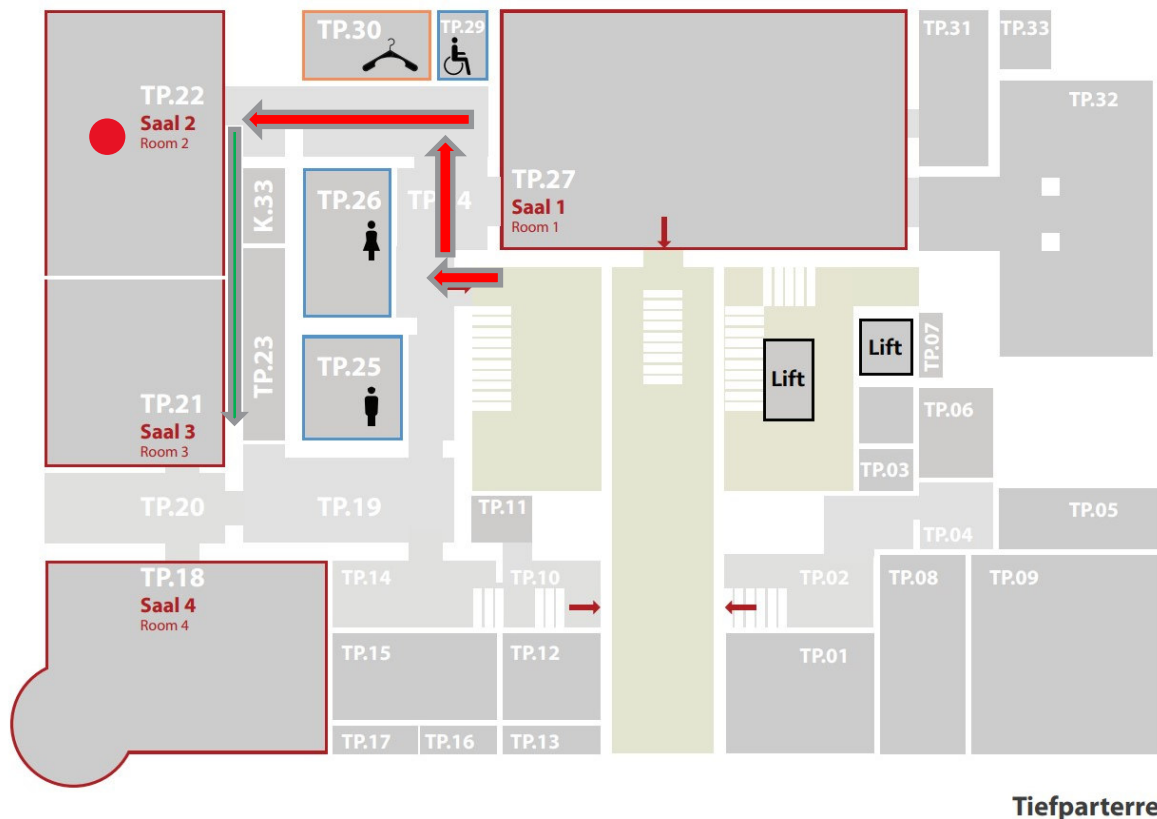


Figure 16: Room plan Ebendorferstraße 7, lower ground floor, function rooms 2+3

To get to function room 3 first go to function room 2 by the way mentioned above. At the entrance to function room 3 continue to the left as marked in green in the picture. The corridor is very narrow and only 72 cm wide at its narrowest point.

1.9.3.1. Data regarding function rooms 2 and 3

Passage width of the door: 1m 20 cm

Desk height (bottom edge of the desktops): 70 cm

Seating is adaptable. Chairs are equipped with backrests. Desks are wheelchair accessible.

The room is equipped with power sockets.

1.9.3.2. Technical equipment

The room does not have an inductive hearing system. Lighting is not glare-free.

1.9.4. Function room 4

After leaving the stair lift and going through the glass door turn left. At the end of the corridor turn right. After the passage (width at the narrowest point: 78 cm) you will find the entrance to function room 4 on the right.

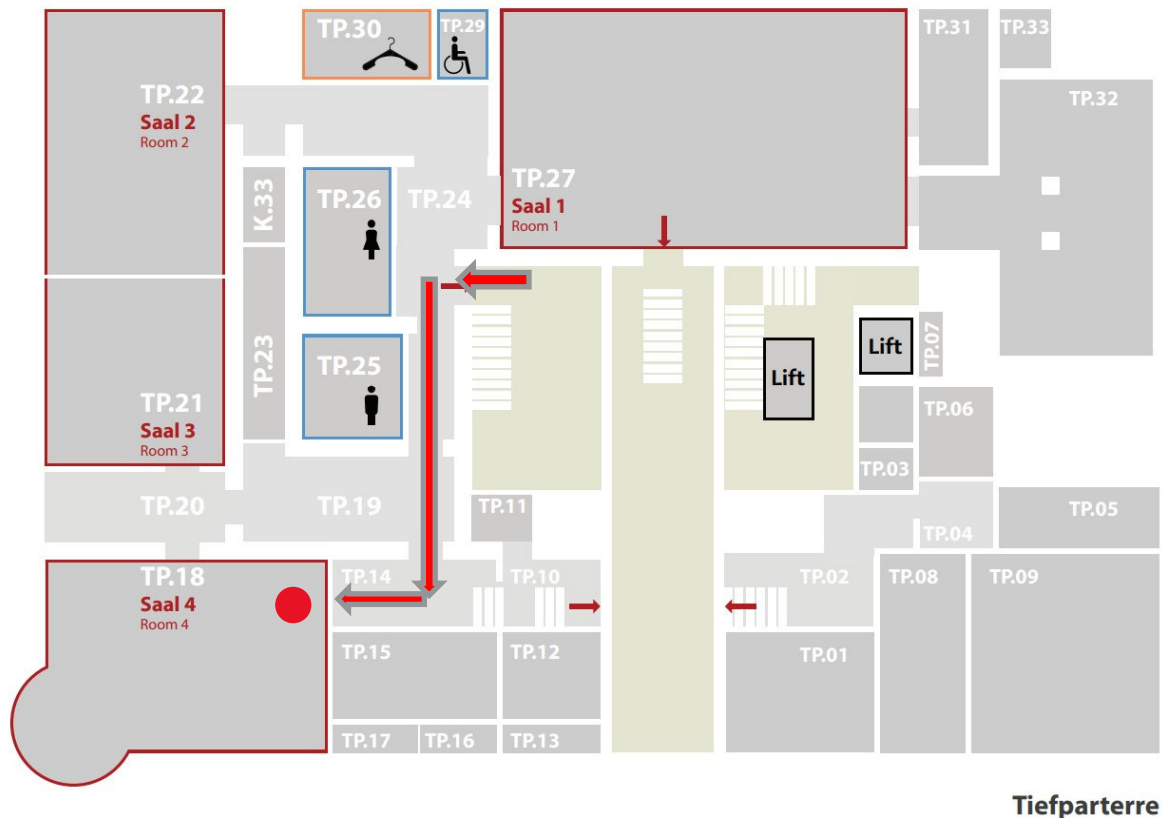


Figure 17: Room plan Ebendorferstraße 7, lower ground floor, function room 4

1.9.4.1. Data regarding function room 4

Passage width of the door: 1 m 38 cm

Desk height (bottom edge of the desktops): 70 cm

Seating is adaptable. Chairs are equipped with backrests. Desks are wheelchair accessible. The room is equipped with power sockets.

1.9.4.2. Technical equipment

Room 4 does not have an inductive hearing system. Lighting is not glare-free.

1.10. Accessible toilet on the lower ground floor

There is an accessible toilet on the lower ground floor in room TP 29 close to the entrance to function room 1.

From the exit of the stair lift you will reach the accessible toilet by going through the glass door and then turning right and straight ahead along the corridor.

You will enter the toilet through a hinged door to be opened manually. The door opens outwards.

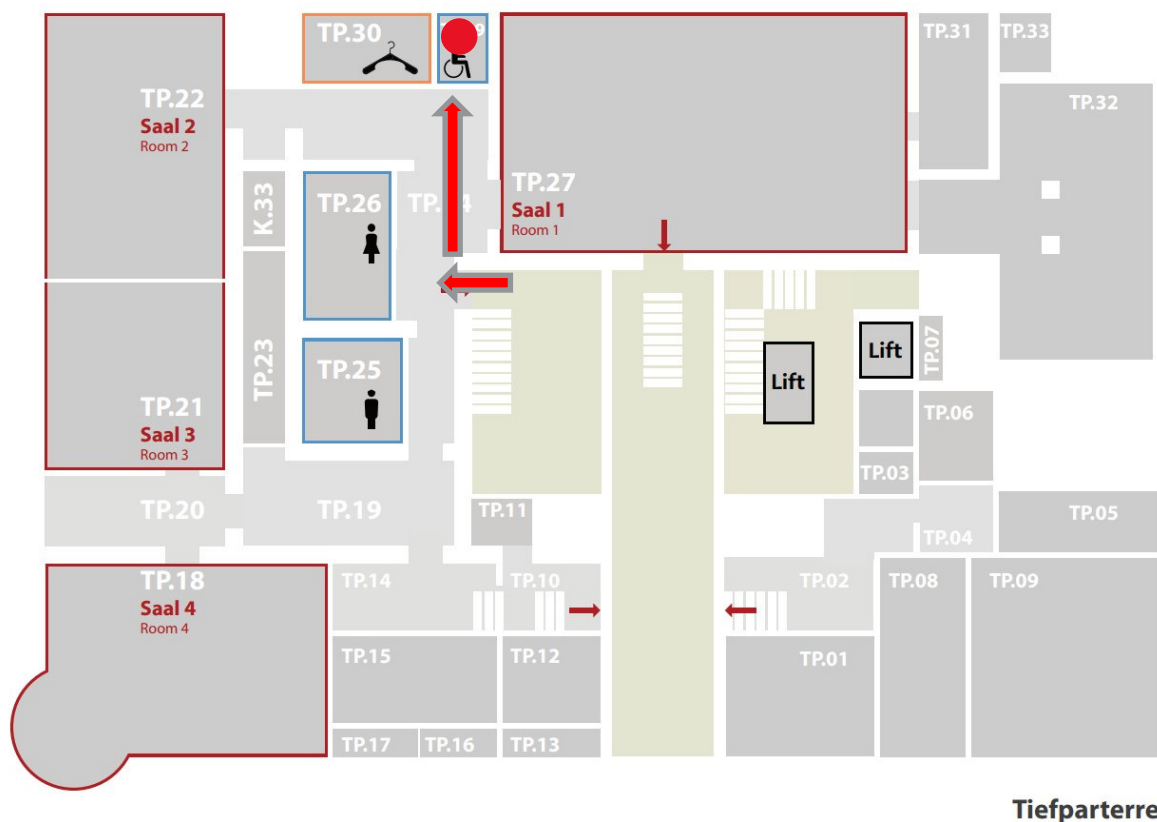


Figure 18: Room plan Ebendorferstraße 7, lower ground floor, accessible toilet

1.10.1. Data regarding the accessible toilet:

Depth of the toilet seat: 45/69 cm

Height of the toilet seat: 47 cm

Toilet accessible by wheelchair from the left side.

Equipped with grab rails (L-shaped grab rail on the wall side and fold-down rail). The turning radius is 150 cm.

The washbasin is wheelchair accessible

Height of the controls for the fittings: 85 cm

The disinfectant is at a height of 1 m 45 cm.

There is an emergency alarm cord, which will connect you to the reception staff.

1.11. Escape routes

There is an escape route plan on each floor of the OeAD building. There are signs indicating the fire extinguishers and the escape routes are marked with green illuminated signs.

1.12. Additional information

Assistance dogs are allowed.

Unfortunately we do not have any staff members who speak Austrian sign language.
