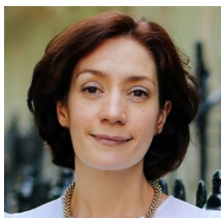

She is a member of several Boards and advisory committees, including the Education Sector Advisory group of the Department for Education /Department for International Trade; the Board of UKRI's Fund for International Collaboration; the British Council's Education Advisory Group. She is a graduate in English Literature from the University of Cambridge.¹
